### **CELEBRATING IMPORTANT DAYS & OCCASIONS**

### **WORLD DOCTORS DAY**

In Bijapur, the World Doctors Day was observed in coordination with the Lions Blood Bank. The Chief Guest was Dr Premananda Ambli, Vice President, All India Medical Council. Among the other speakers were Dr PK Bhavishetti, Principal, Ayurvedic Medical College; Dr SR Patil, HoD, Department of Community Medicine, BLDE Medical College; Miss Anjali Talikoti, Secretary, Lions Blood Bank; and Mr VN Kotawal, PO. The importance of doctors, their dedication and the role they play in the community, were among the topics discussed.





#### Theme: Investing in teenage girls

Awareness programmes, plays and competitions marked the celebrations at our Belgaum Branch. Prof GK Khadabadi, President, inaugurated the event. Sixteen students from selected schools took part, and six prizes were given away. In the awareness event organised at the Chandragiri Mahila BEd College, Parampujya Shri Gurusidda Mahaswamiji Karanjimath blessed the programme. Students from the college enacted a play on the benefits of having a small family. Participants: Over 150.



In our Bellary Branch, IEC material was distributed through an exclusive stall in an exhibition that was going on in the municipal ground in the city. The stall caught the attention of visitors and the branch staff was able to educate people on HIV/AIDS, TB and family planning. Messages on safe abortion, and services available with the RHFPC (including HIV and RNTCP programmes) were highlighted for the benefit of visitors. A total of 1,548 participants (900 female, 648 male) benefitted from the initiative.

Our Bijapur Branch observed the day at a Youth Friendly Center in the Government Polytechnic College Campus. Mr D Randeep, Deputy Commissioner of Bijapur gave the inaugural address. Dr S Gundappa, DHO: Mr D Davanada, District Coordinator, Nehru Yuva Kendra, Government of India; and Mr VN Kotawal, PO, were the other speakers. The celebrations ended with an elaborate discussion among the participants and resource persons. A total of 104 people took part (61 female, 43 male).

In Dharwad, the branch organised various programmes on World Population Day to involve adolescents, community stakeholders, parents and teachers. The event was conducted in association with schools, NGOs and ASHAs. The programmes ranged from WPDs for adolescents to awareness sessions for SHGs, interactions and a radio talk. The activities were covered by a local television channel, apart from coverage in newspapers and radio. Over 500 took part in the celebration.



In our **Hyderabad Branch**, the day was observed with a meeting among local leaders, PHC staff and ASHAs. Dr Supriya, MO, was the chairperson and she spoke about the theme, 'Investing in teenage girls'. She informed the audience that one maternal death takes place every 15 minutes in India - hence the need to provide high quality maternal health services to all ANCs without delay. In this context, the government's programme for Mother and Child Health, 'Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matritya Abhiyan' was mentioned and its objectives elaborated. Participants: 31.

Our Kalchini Branch observed the special day in association with the Department of Health, Government of West Bengal and the Family Welfare Samiti. The theme was: 'Zimmedri Nibhao: Plan Banao'. The celebration was in two phases: In the first phase, a tableau with messages and hoardings was covered the whole block to generate awareness. In the second phase, a spectacular rally by ASHAs and CBPs was organised. As per the plan, several Minilap Tubectomy and NSV operation camps were arranged between July 7 and 23. Outcome: 345 Minilap Tubectomy operations and 54 NSV operations were conducted. 57 clients used IUCD at the RHFPC. Participants: 112.

In Kolkata, a rally was organised to celebrate the World Population Day, in association with the District Family Welfare Office (DWFO). The 5km rally took off from the DWFO office in Sealdah at 10:30am, and went on till 11:30am. IEC material was distributed along the route of the rally, meeting the objective of spreading awareness about family planning and the advantages of having a small family.

Our Madurai Branch celebrated World Population Day with competitions in essay writing, drawing and elocution around the theme, 'To protect and empower youth'. 78 students took part in the drawing competition (with 9 winners) and 50 students participated in essay writing and elocution. Mr S Parthiban, Branch Manager, distributed the prizes.

To observe the World Population Day, in Mohali, an awareness-cumhealth check up camp was organised at different venues. Several aspects of population growth and controlling population were highlighted. Around 150 people took part in the proceedings.

In **Shimoga**, a 5km rally was organised – from IMA Hall to the District Commissioner's Office - to spread awareness about population and its

implications. An exhibition and elocution competition were also held to mark the occasion. It was a collaborative effort, organised in association with the DHO, Spandana Health Foundation Trust, JCI Shimoga Bhavana, paramedical colleges and NGOs like Rotary Club and Lions Club.
