Family Planning Association of India (FPA India) founded in 1949, is a national voluntary organization which pioneered the family planning movement in India.

The Association works on a wide range of SRH (Sexual and Reproductive Health) issues encompassing family planning, comprehensive sexuality education, maternal health, child survival, adolescent care, HIV/AIDS, safe abortion, reproductive tract

cancer screening and prevention and mitigation of gender-based violence (GBV) for all, including the poor, vulnerable and young people.

In view of the Association's commendable work, the Government of India issued a Commemorative postal stamp in honour of FPA India's 50th year of existence.

23% women (aged 20-24) are married before the age 18 years



70.1 Unintended pregnancies in India per 1000 women annually (aged 15-49 years)

One in five women give birth before their 18th birthday



One in three women have experienced physical/sexual violence

23% women aged 15-24 do not have access to menstrual hygiene products



Three in five girls (aged 15-19) are anemic

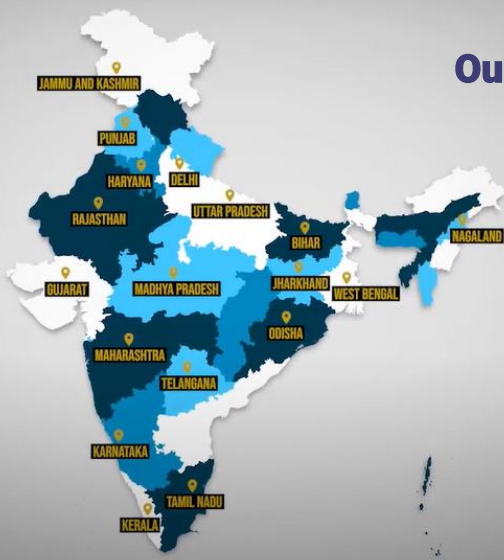

Gender and Rights

We promote gender equality by

- Upholding the Sexual Reproductive Health & Rights
- Improving the economic status of poor & vulnerable individual & communities.

In 2021, we trained **5,054** poor and vulnerable people for income generation skills.

We train and sensitize Young people to be Champions of Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights of Young People

In 2021

1,774 Peer educators trained on imparting CSE
1,504 Teachers trained
21,009 Online CSE Sessions
2,58,041 young people trained in comprehensive sexuality Education

Our comprehensive quality SRH & other essential services

In 2021 we provided **2,71,54,768** health services to **46,26,418** people through **67** clinics, **64** mobile outreach units, **560** community based providers, **271** partner clinics and agencies and through telemedicine.

And averted **102,763** Unintended pregnancies, **68,254** Unsafe abortions and **8,085** Maternal DALYs
